# Mobile Construction Classrooms

Construction Youth Trust and Safer Wales have worked together to offer support to female ex-offenders under the age of 25 in Wales.

Construction Youth Trust run construction taster sessions in their mobile classroom for women, in order to give them an insight into the different careers available to them in the industry. By engaging with women, they encourage them to seek training and employment opportunities.

The Women's Turnaround Project provides a mentoring service to the women to address additional support needs. The project is ongoing and due to finish in February 2010.

The days which ran in September 2008 and September 2009, provided an opportunity for organisations to raise awareness of their services to inmates at the prison.

# Support for Londoners at YOI Ashfield

Based at YOI Ashfield, PEOPLE were aware that a large proportion of the inmates at the prison would be returning to London. St Giles provides a support service to young offenders returning to London.

A St Giles support worker is based at Ashfield every other week and engages with young people to provide mentoring and support which continues in the community upon release. All beneficiaries are referred to PEOPLE's NVQ courses, and PEOPLE and St Giles share information on each beneficiary.

57 young men have been supported to date.

# Documentary

IP3 partners wished to find a way to challenge popular stereotypes of the young people that they work with. Safer Wales, Addaction and Construction Youth came together to produce an informative, educational and emotive documentary that would provide an accurate portrayal of young offenders with the aim of it being broadcast on mainstream television.

Spirit Level Films were commissioned to make the documentary and the project is well under way. Filming is complete and a rough cut has been produced. The film includes interviews with young offenders, politicians, social commentators and people working in the criminal justice system.

The film is due to be launched in early 2010.
